

Additional Information	Not a regional district but part of Metro Vancouver. In June 2010 Metro Vancouver adopted its Corporate Climate Action Plan (CCAP). The purpose of the CCAP is to set out strategies and actions towards achieving Metro Vancouver's commitment to corporate carbon neutrality and to adapt our corporate infrastructure and activities to the anticipated consequences of climate change.
	In October 2011 Metro Vancouver adopted the Integrated Air Quality and Greenhouse Gas Management Plan. One of this plan's three goals is to "Minimize the region's contribution to global climate change", and this goal includes 5 strategies and 37 actions for Metro Vancouver, its member municipalities and other partners that will reduce greenhouse gas emissions in the region.
