What can the public do to help?

- Landscape walls, fences and storefronts with plants. Graffiti and litter is less common in landscaped areas.
- Increase lighting and visibility in vulnerable areas.
- Talk to your kids about graffiti and respect for the community

2. Record

If you are a victim of graffiti vandalism it is important that you record the photographs will provide evidence should the responsible party be found and prosecuted.

3. Remove

- Failure to remove graffiti leaves an impression that no one cares about our community.
- Graffiti vandals want their vandalism to be seen, once they realize that their graffiti is removed quickly from a location, they will likely move on.
- It may take several removals to deter the vandals however patience and persistence will pay off.

What Is Graffiti?

There are many forms of graffiti.

These include writing, symbols, etching or drawing applied to any public or private property without the consent of the owner.

Graffiti is not art but an act of vandalism and it is a crime.

Vandals will use spray paint, felt pens, knives, or etching tools to commit their crime.

Graffiti is an offensive sight which detracts from the beauty of our community.

Graffiti may also be obscene, racist or hateful and is sometimes connected with gang or other criminal activity. Graffiti should be taken seriously and removed as soon as possible.

Why Should We Care?

Graffiti, if left unchecked, may:

- Reduce property values
- Create an undesirable image of our city
- Undermine residents' and visitors' sense
 of safety and security
- Heighten fear of crime in the community
- Cause small businesses to close as local economy declines
- Destroy public and private property
- Divert tax dollars from the delivery of other City Services



By removing graffiti quickly and consistently, we show the pride we have in our community and we send a message that the community cares and won't tolerate vandalism.

Where Does Graffiti Occur and How Can It Be Removed?

Painting over graffiti may be the easiest way: however there are special cleaner available if this is impractical.

Graffiti on wooden surfaces can often be removed with a stiff wire brush.

Professional graffiti removal companies can be located in the phone book if necessary.

Popular graffiti targets are generally in high visibility locations including:

- Public and private buildings
- Recreational facilities
- Newspaper boxes
- Municipal benches
- Parks and playgrounds
- Fences and walls
- Bridges and overpasses
- Public transit property and vehicles
- Canada Post & Utility Company Boxes
