







- Identified as one of the custodians of White Rock's history
- Kept things together for the museum and archives almost single handedly in the 1990s
- Awarded with the Queen's Diamond Jubilee, in 2012, at City Hall

 - Roles held at hospital include: president of the hospital auxiliary, trustee of the Peace Arch Hospital Board and board chair of the PAHCHF
- 2012: Recipient of Queen's Diamond Jubilee




COMMUNITY BUILDERS - VIN COYNE


COMMUNITY BUILDERS – BARBARA COOPER



- 2000: Honoured with the Prime Minister's Award for Teaching Excellence
- 2013: Named White Rock's Outstanding Canadian on the Peninsula for her innovative leadership and significant contributions promoting arts and culture
- Served as board of director in both White Rock and Surrey, including on arts-related civic committees
- Currently acts as Semiahmoo Arts' Literary Program Liaison, assists with White Rock's Irish Festival and co-ordinates the Double Exposure photography and poetry events, and so much more



COMMUNITY BUILDERS—JOE O'MALLEY



- 2011: Outstanding Canadian of the Year
 - Taught at White Rock Elementary for 35 years
 - Was honoured for the thousands of extra hours he spent coaching soccer, volleyball and track and field and organizing various sports tournaments.
 - Under Joe's leadership, White Rock
 Elementary school won the Barry Morley
 Memorial Track and Field Championships –
 Large Schools Division so many times that
 they presented the trophy to the school and
 bought a new one!


