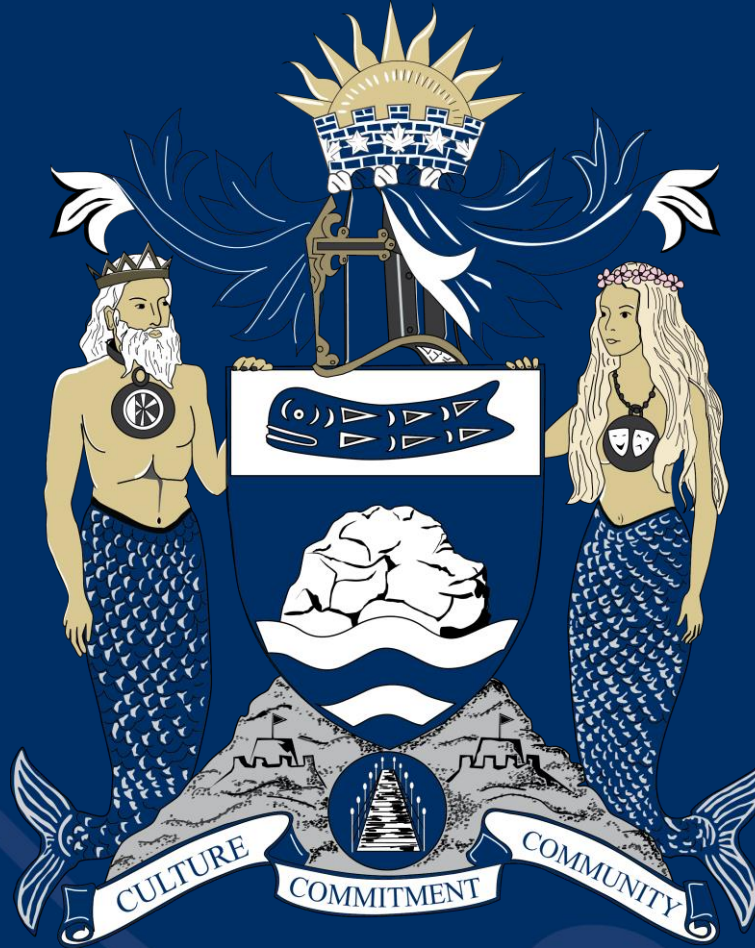

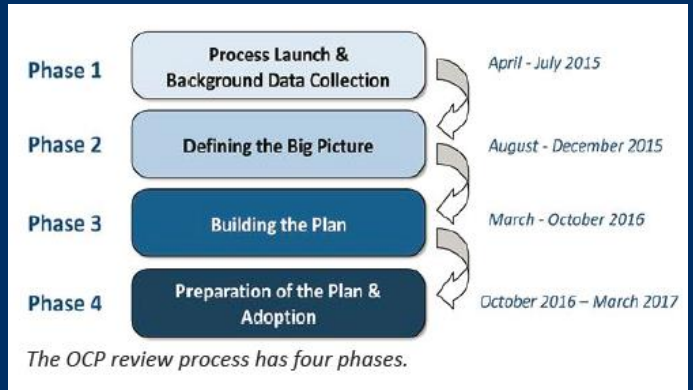

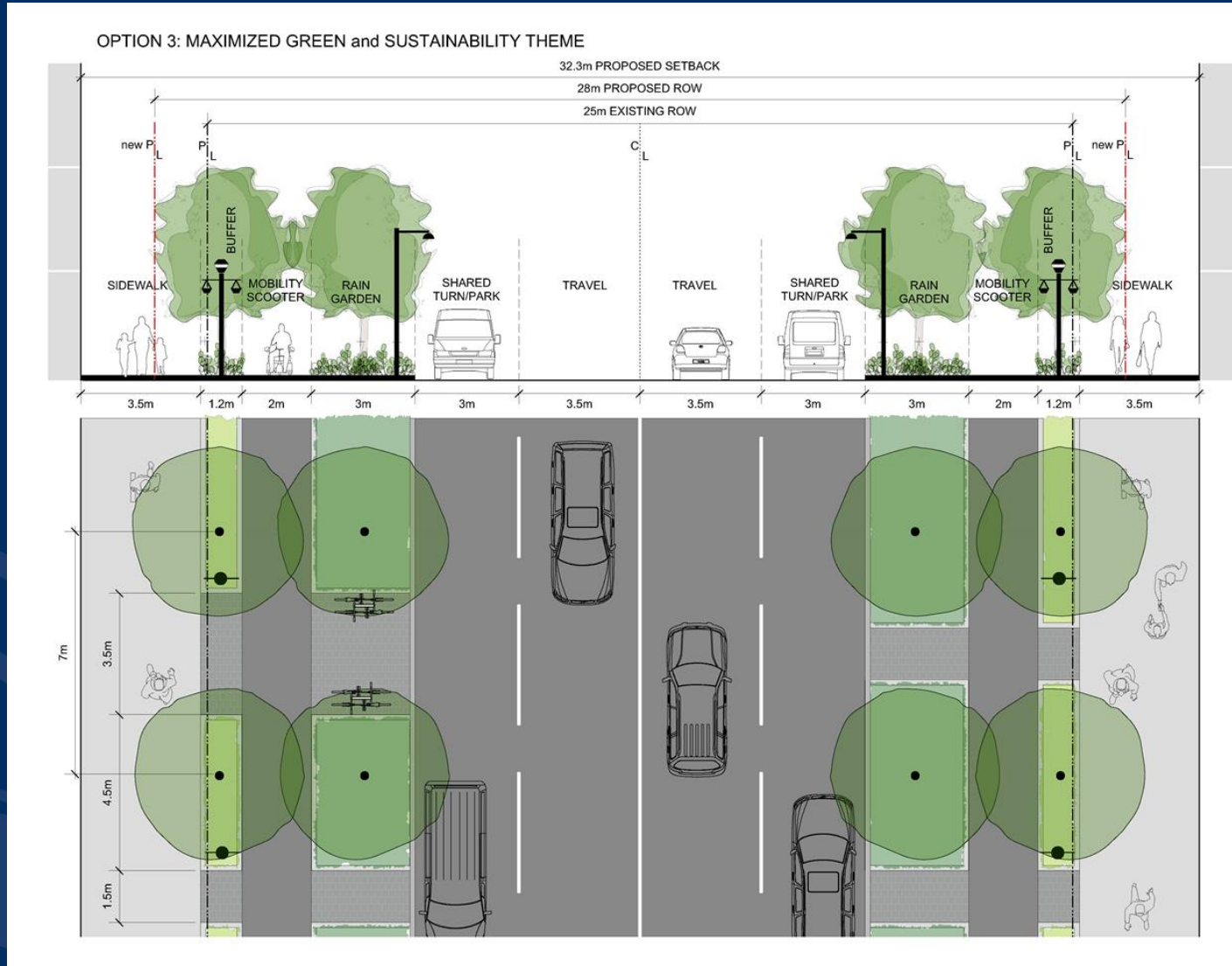

Striking the Right Balance-The Newly Revised Design



Summary of changes made

- Retains Washroom Option 2; still requires a new accessible path/ramp combo integrated into park.
- retains flex spaces in lieu of Parking.
- eliminates all parking except 3 stalls on Marine.
- removes street trees on Upper promenade which allows more lawn on north edge of Great Lawn, removed other trees too.
- eliminated some mid-terraces, now more contiguous lawn.
- interactive water remains in "Flex Plaza" (as budget allows?)
- integrated wrap around stadium seating and wide platform steps with Grand Stair extending into Lawn's east edge.
- a little more green added to respect Public wishes/feedback (as gardens in Plaza space)
- majority of Lower Promenade at 12' wide.
- Upper Promenade narrowed to allow more Great Lawn (8' wide).
- maintained a mid-ramp area "Overlook Deck" ideal for events.

The "Flex Plaza" is for festivals, concerts and any "pop-up" Events, bookable space for use in the City!
Parking is gained at Waterfront Parkade

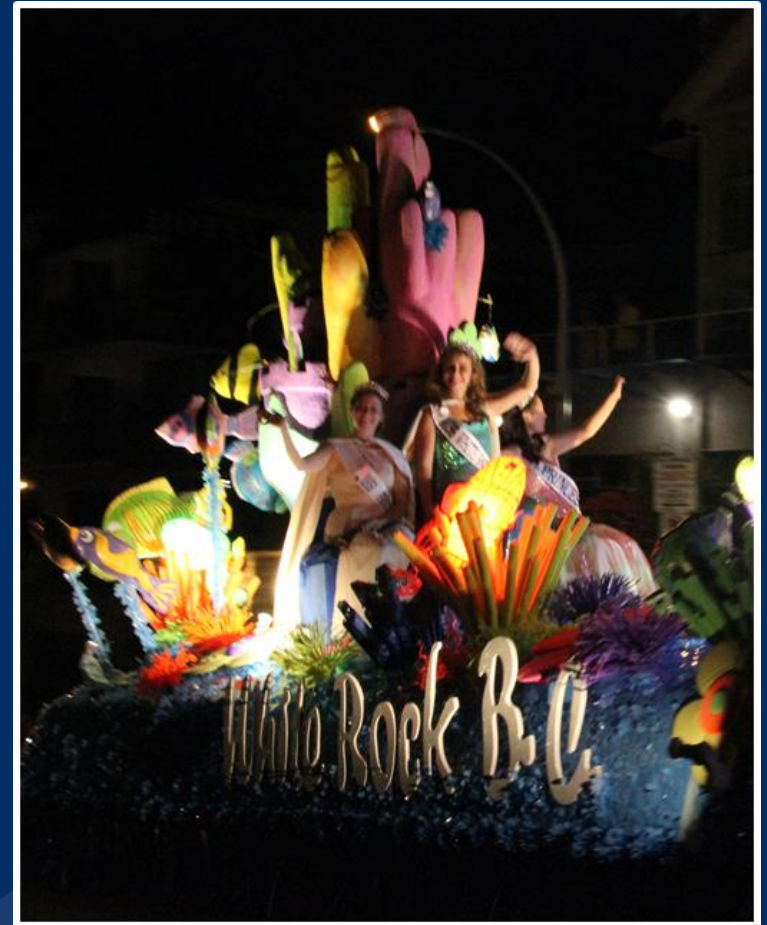

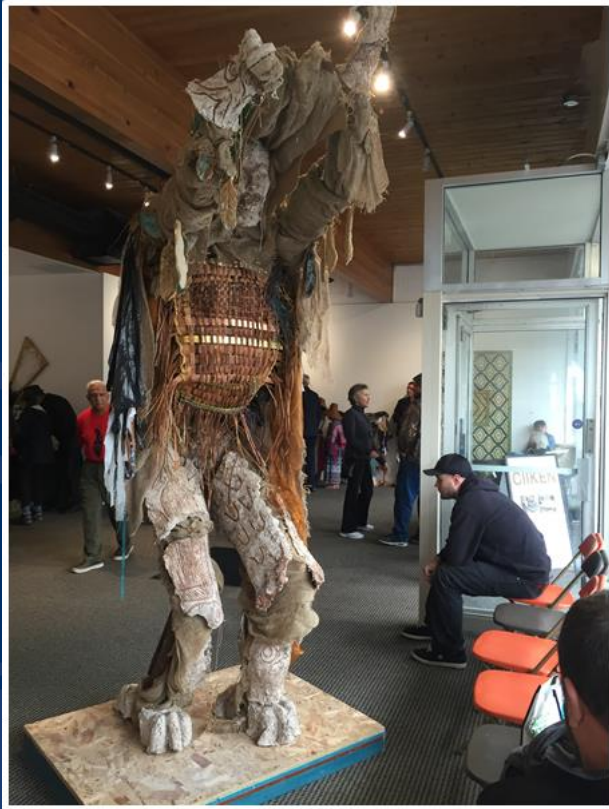

GRAHAM SITE RULES

1. A Site Safety Orientation is mandatory before commencing work.
2. Minimum PPE (Eye protection, hard hat, safety glasses, steel toe boots, and hi-visibility vests).
3. Drink lots of water and electrolyte powder is required for overhead hoists.
4. Personnel under the influence of drugs, alcohol, or alcohol will be denied access to the work site. Workers suspected of being under the influence of drugs, alcohol or other substances, due to their performance or behavior, will be removed from the site.
5. Any worker determined by the site to be at risk for falls will be removed from the site.
6. Fallprotection 100 feet: All areas require fall protection to be used in 100-foot areas.
7. Safety harness and lanyard are required in a confined space required to be used in the immediate area.
8. The area will be demarcated as a hazard area with no substitutes for unobstructed personnel.
9. Confined Space 100 feet: All workers will be used while safety harness are removed. Hoisting will be required 100 feet. The worker leaves the area.
10. Confined Space 100 feet: Confined space must adhere to transfer 100 feet 100 feet above ground level.
11. Only properly trained workers will be used. Scaffold guards and beams must be of sound material and clear of defects.
12. All scaffolding will include guardrails and will be tagged for use.
13. Hoisting, hoisting, lighting and other violations of worker safety rules will not be tolerated and will result in dismissal.
14. Hazards and other unsafe areas are prohibited from use.
15. Workers failing to comply with the Graham Safety Program, WCA Regulations, or OSHA site rules will be removed from the site immediately.

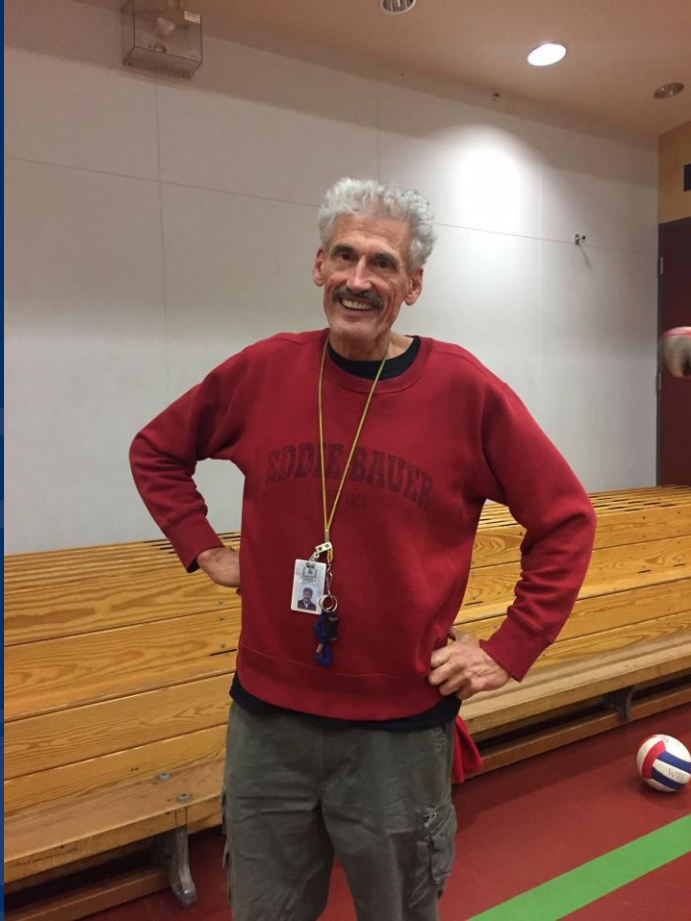
