



SINGLE DAY WASTE COLLECTION INCLUDING GREEN CAN

Starting next week, White Rock residents that participate in the yard trimmings program **will enjoy having all waste collected on a single day each week!**

Under the previous collection program, yard waste and garbage were collected on different days of the week. With the new system, which starts next week, everything is collected on one day! On your regularly scheduled garbage day, place your garbage, recycling, and green can at the curb. It's that simple!

As the Green Can program is merely an extension of the yard trimming program, residents don't need to make a lot of changes.

Here are four easy steps to participating in the Green Can program:

1. Make any 45 litres can (or less) a Green Can! Simply attach a Green Can sticker on the outside of your current yard trimming can or continue using your yard trimmings decal as it all goes to the same composting facility. You can place a Kraft-type paper bag inside the can to help keep it clean.
2. Collect all your food scraps and food-soiled paper in a lidded container or in a small paper food waste bag in your kitchen. You can also reuse an ice cream bucket or other lidded container.
3. Empty your kitchen food scraps container, or toss the small lined Kraft bag, into your Green Can, along with any yard trimmings you might have.
4. Place your Green Can at the curb, with the sticker facing out, along with any extra yard trimmings in labelled bins or paper Kraft-type bags on your designated collection day.

Residents wishing to use Bag to Earth food waste bags can now buy them from the following City facilities:
