The following quiz will help determine if your home is an easy target for thieves.
Circle the best answer to each question.

1. How well do you know your neighbors?

- a. You don't know them, but you'd like to.
- b. You mind your own business, so should they?
- c. You know your neighbours and their schedules well.

2. The doors in your home are secured with

- a. Steel door chains.
- b. Dead bolt locks.
- c. Easy-opened with credit card, in case you forget your key.

3. If locked out of your house, what's the best way to get back in?

- a. Use something from your unlocked tool shed.
- b. A locksmith is the only way past the deadbolts on the doors and the bars on the windows.
- c. The spare key from under the potted plant.

4. How often do you leave your door unlocked?

- a. Never. Not even when you're home.
- b. You sometimes leave the back door unlocked, but only when you go to the store.
- c. Always. Making it that much easier to catch thieves in the act.

5. Your property is surrounded by

- a. Six-foot hedges that block out the world.
- b. Trimmed trees and shrubs, creating clear lines of sight.
- c. A giant steel wall.

6. You keep your valuables

Answers:

1	Belonging to Block Watch can reduce break-ins in your neighbourhood by 40%.	C
2	Many door and window locks are secured by small screws, making them vulnerable to a simple kick. Windows and doors that can't be seen from the street need extra security.	B
3	Most thieves break in through ground level doors and windows, often by using tools or heavy objects they find on your property. Leaving a spare key under the flowerpot makes it easier for thieves to get in.	B
4	Some thieves watch to determine your schedule. There is never a safe time to leave doors and windows unlocked.	A
5	Thieves like to work where they can't be seen from the street. A well-lit property with entrances easily visible from the street is not attractive to thieves.	B
6	Most thieves steal cash and valuables that are easy to find. Odds are your safety deposit box will never be stolen.	C
7	Alarms work. Thieves will often avoid a house that have one.	C
8	Thieves prefer to break into homes when they think no one is home. Timers attached to lights, TV or stereos help create the illusion of occupancy	A
9	While thieves prefer the ease of ground floor entrances, they sometimes rely on homeowners who don't secure upstairs windows.	C
10	Thieves need a way to carry all your valuables. Leaving your car keys in a visible location will help them to do just that.	B

Score

8 or more correct: Your home is a castle. Thieves be warned.

5 to 7 correct: Your home is a difficult target, but could still be tougher.

4 or less correct: You are helping thieves. But it's never too late to raise your score.
