# 2. Building Heights Outside the Town Centre: Digital Public Open House and Survey

**Summary:** Staff will be presenting options for changes to the Official Community Plan (OCP) for Building Heights outside of the Town Centre at a digital public open house on Jan. 14, 2021. (See the <u>LINK</u> for details on accessing the Microsoft Teams live event). After the event, on Jan. 15, a community survey will be launched on <u>talkwhiterock.ca/ocp-review</u> to obtain feedback on the options presented and to collect any other thoughts the community wants to share on this topic.

The Jan. 14 event will be recorded and made available for later viewing on the City's <u>YouTube</u> channel. Further details on the options to be presented are available in the related report on the Jan. 11 agenda of Land Use and Planning Committee. (See the <u>LINK</u>, beginning at page 217.)

    results and proposed bylaw changes for the OCP Review.
  - Any bylaw changes would involve a public hearing before a final decision is made.

# 3. Marine Drive Stabilization and Bin Wall Repair

**Department:** Engineering and Municipal Operations

**Summary:** The project for the stabilization of Marine Drive with micro piles is nearing completion. An investigation of the metal bin walls located on the slope below Marine Drive was included in the scope of this project. Once the materials overlaying the bin wall structural components were removed it

became evident that these components were significantly deteriorated. The Geotechnical Engineer recommended that these bin walls be strengthened within five years.

While these bin walls are no longer integral to the stability of Marine Drive due to the micro pile installation, their failure could result in materials sliding down the slope onto the railway and Promenade below. Council awarded \$500,000 to the companies currently finalizing the Marine Drive Stabilization Project to repair the bin walls with soil anchors and shotcrete.

This final work to install anchors and protect the bin walls with shotcrete is delayed two weeks due to the recent extremely wet weather, although the project remains slightly under budget. Construction completion is scheduled for the end of January.

#### Remaining work and schedule:

- · The contractor is currently anchoring the bin walls.
- The contractor will shotcrete the bin wall with full encapsulation to protect the metal from the elements to extend the life span of the wall.
- The contractor will schedule temporary roadwork repairs and return in March to repave the road for the final product.
- The contractor will schedule temporary sidewalk repairs and return in March for the final product.
- Alternating traffic will be required during construction hours for permanent road works and the sidewalk on Marine Drive in March. (A full road closure is not required.)
- The schedule will be extended to the end of January due to weather conditions and the full encapsulation work.
- Two-way traffic will be reinstated once the shotcrete work is complete at the end of January.
- The contractor will be demobilized at the end of January and return in March, as noted above.

# 7. New Sculpture Installed, Not Unveiled Yet

**Department: Recreation and Culture** 

**Summary:** Passersby may notice a large, covered structure at the corner of George Street and Thrift Avenue. This is Metz & Chew's *The Great Blue*. It is a large-scale metal heron sculpture for the Marcon development. It was paid for by the developer with a member of the Public Art Advisory Committee and the former Cultural Development Manager participating as jurors on the selection panel. A public art consultant was contracted by the developer to facilitate the process. The sculpture will remain covered until the unveiling takes place, after residents have moved in.

# 8. Update from the Fire Chief on COVID-19

**Department:** White Rock Fire Rescue

**Summary:** The Province reported 761 new cases of <u>COVID-19</u> yesterday along with eight more deaths —all associated with long-term care facilities. Thursday's reported case count was the highest one-day total of new cases since Dec. 13. The province's death toll now stands at 970.

There are currently 6,349 active cases in the province with another 8,849 people isolating due to possible exposure. The number of active cases has dropped by over 3,000 in the last month. B.C. has now recorded 56,015 total cases with approximately 84 per cent having recovered.

Of the new cases, 484, or 64 per cent, are in the Fraser Health region, 96 cases, or 13 per cent, are in Interior Health, and 94 cases, or 12 per cent, are in the Vancouver Coastal Health region. The Province

reports 372 patients in hospital with 74 of those in intensive care.

The Province has now provided at least one dose of the COVID-19 vaccine to 41,064 people.

# 2 Parking Update: Decals, Permits and Return to Paid Waterfront Parking

# 3. White Rock Elementary Expansion: Public Information Meeting Feb. 3

**Department: Planning and Development Services** 

**Summary**: A Public Information Meeting will be hosted by the Board of Education School District No. 36, Surrey, on Wednesday, Feb. 3 from 5:30 to 6:30 p.m. The meeting will be run as a "Live Event" using Microsoft Teams.

The purpose of the meeting is to introduce a proposed Development Variance Permit application to permit a 1,046 square-metre (11,255 square-foot) addition/extension to the east side of White Rock Elementary School, adding eight classrooms to the school building. The variance would allow the addition to have heights of 12.4 metres to the "top of ridge" and 15.7 metres to the "top of cupola," which would match the height of the existing ridge and cupola. The existing Civic/Institutional Use (P-1) Zone sets a maximum height of 10.7 metres. All other P-1 Zone standards and the general standards of City of White Rock Zoning Bylaw, 2012, No. 2000 would be upheld.

At the time the elementary school building was constructed, the zoning did not have a maximum building height. The proposed addition is to an area of the school where there was previously a three-storey building.

#### Digital Approach to Public Information Meeting

The digital approach to the meeting is being used to protect the health and safety of the public during the ongoing COVID-19 pandemic. City staff will be in attendance to introduce and monitor the meeting and to report back to Council. The proponent will provide a presentation at the start of the meeting, followed by a question-and-answer period.

# 4. Curling Season Cancelled Due to COVID-19 Restrictions

**Department:** Recreation and Culture

**Summary:** The Peace Arch Curling Club (PACC) Board of Directors has decided to cancel the remainder of this year's curling season due to the impacts of COVID-19 and related public health orders.

On Dec. 8, 2020, public health orders were released banning all indoor adult team sports until Jan. 8, 2021. This restriction forced the PACC to stop play, and to await the outcome of the Provincial Health Officer's reassessment.

On Jan. 7, 2021, the Provincial Health Officer stated that the current Public Health Orders, including the ban on all indoor adult team sports, will apply until Feb. 5, 2021 at midnight.

Based on this latest announcement, the PACC Board of Directors met on Jan. 9, 2021 and decided to cancel curling for the remainder of the 2020-21 season. The Board will review the financial impact of closing the club, and plan to restart curling in fall 2021.

The club plans to begin ice removal this week.

Candlelight Cuisine will continue to operate its catering and meal preparation service at the curling club and the club manager will continue to work in the office until the end of April 2021. City staff will work with the curling club manager to explore possible recreational activities or rentals for the roughly 9,000 square-foot dry floor area during the curling shutdown.

# 8. Update from the Fire Chief on COVID-19

**Department:** White Rock Fire Rescue

**Summary:** The Province reported 536 new cases of <u>COVID-19</u> yesterday along with seven additional deaths. Thursday's report lowered the seven-day average for new cases in the province to 517. The province's death toll now stands at 1,038, increasing by 68 over the week.

There are currently 4,624 active cases in the province with another 7,303 people isolating due to possible exposure. The number of active cases is now at the lowest it's been since Nov. 6, and fewer than half of the 10,039 active cases recorded at their peak on Dec. 14.

B.C. has now recorded 59,608 total cases with approximately 88 per cent of those cases recovered.

Of the new cases, 253, or 47 per cent, are in the Fraser Health region; 115, or 21 per cent, are in Interior Health; and 102 cases, or 19 per cent, are in the Vancouver Coastal Health region. The Province reports 362 patients in hospital with 74 patients in intensive care.

The Province has now provided at least one dose of the COVID-19 vaccine to 69,746 people, representing 1.36 per cent of the province's population.



These are followed by primary routes, neighborhood collectors and solid waste routes. The City then takes care of all the side roads, including lanes. Crews are ready to respond to snow 24 hours a day, seven days a week.

"We'd like to apologize for the intermittent load speed issues you are experiencing with your engagementHQ portal. We regret the inconvenience and understand there is no worse time to have an outage or slow site performance than when you have invited your community to provide feedback...

Until Friday, we had not seen traffic at these levels in 13 years and, while this is testing us, we are also excited that such massive engagement is happening and are determined that we will be able to accommodate this level of engagement without any hiccups going forward.

We apologize for the inconvenience, frustration and extra work these outages have caused. We are working hard to eliminate bottlenecks to ensure smooth operation right now as we deal with the traffic surge."

Using Zoom, Recreation and Culture can provide this opportunity to older adults who are unable to attend an in-person class due to vulnerability or mobility issues. Other courses being offered using Zoom include *Turning Memories into Memoirs* and three workshops co-sponsored with the Seniors' Health and Wellness Institute.

# 7. Marine Drive Stabilization and Bin Wall Repair

**Department:** Engineering and Municipal Operations

**Summary:** The project for the stabilization of Marine Drive with micro piles is nearing completion. An investigation of the metal bin walls located on the slope below Marine Drive was included in the scope of this project. Once the materials overlaying the bin wall structural components were removed it became evident that these components were significantly deteriorated. The Geotechnical Engineer recommended that these bin walls be strengthened within five years.

While these bin walls are no longer integral to the stability of Marine Drive due to the micro pile installation, their failure could result in materials sliding down the slope onto the railway and Promenade below. Council awarded \$500,000 to the companies currently finalizing the Marine Drive Stabilization Project to repair the bin walls with soil anchors and shotcrete.

Installation of soil anchors for the bin wall stabilization is now complete. The next step, currently underway, is to coat the walls with shotcrete layered over reinforcing steel.

The project is on track for completion by the end of January. A brief closure will be required in the spring to complete the remaining paving works.

The additional SFS apparatus will supplement White Rock Engine 1, Engine 2 (Auxiliary staff), and a Duty Chief, which our current response model provides.

PAH services both the White Rock and South Surrey communities.

# 11. Update from the Fire Chief on COVID-19

**Department:** White Rock Fire Rescue

**Summary:** The Province reported 564 new cases of <u>COVID-19</u> yesterday along with 15 additional deaths. The province's death toll now stands at 1,119, increasing by 81 over the week.

There are currently 4,450 active cases in the province with another 6,816 people isolating due to possible exposure.

B.C. has now recorded 62,976 total cases with approximately 89 per cent of those having recovered.

Of the new cases, 234, or 41 per cent, are in the Fraser Health region; 111, or 20 per cent, are in Vancouver Coastal; 95, or 17 per cent, are in the Interior Health; and 76 cases, or 13 per cent, are in the Northern Health region. The Province reports 309 patients in hospital with 68 of those being in intensive care. This is the lowest number of COVID-19-related hospitalizations recorded since Nov. 27.

The Province has now provided at least one dose of the COVID-19 vaccine to 104,901 people. Health officials are scheduled to provide an update on B.C.'s COVID-19 vaccine rollout at 10:30 a.m. today. **Contact:** Ed Wolfe

# 1. Funding from UBCM for Housing Needs Report

**Department:** Planning and Development Services

**Summary:** The City of White Rock has been awarded \$30,000 by the Union of BC Municipalities (UBCM) to support the preparation of a Housing Needs Report as required by the Province.

The funding will be largely directed toward hiring a consultant to help carry out public engagement activities with attention given to engaging vulnerable members of the community. The work of the consultant will form part of the narrative of the Housing Needs Report, linking the "lived experience" of White Rock residents with some of the trends highlighted by the data.

- A LITTLE MORE (cannabis accessories) at 1482 Johnston Rd. (Formerly occupied by 'Seashore Music & Games')
- LEELA THAI RESTAURANT at 1558 George St. (This restaurant was previously at 1310 Johnston Rd.)

# 3. Noise Extension Approved to Avoid Impact to Adjacent Businesses – 1545 Johnston Rd.

**Department:** Planning and Development Services

**Summary:** The commercial building at 1545 Johnston Rd., formerly the Penguin Meats location, will be undergoing renovations in the coming weeks. As part of this work, they are removing interior concrete walls that originally formed vaults for the Montreal Trust Company.

In order to remove these concrete walls and limit the noise and vibration from the required jackhammering to the adjacent businesses—Family Care Pharmacy and Johnston Road Dental— the City approved a noise extension to allow this work to begin at 6 a.m. Jackhammering will occur before 9 a.m. and will stop during business hours. Work will not continue past the Noise Bylaw evening cut-off of 7 p.m.

This current approval is valid for Feb. 2 to 5 and Feb. 8 to 9, 2021, weekdays only. The concrete removal is not expected to be fully completed at the end of this period. Any requests for additional noise extensions for this work will be considered along with any feedback received during this initial period.

- The jackhammering will occur outside of business hours, between 6 and 9 a.m., and potentially after adjacent businesses close.
- Any further requests for noise extensions for this work will be evaluated after this initial period concludes.

## 4. Pay Parking: Shoulder Season Feb. 1 to March 31

**Department:** Financial Services

**Summary**: The City of White Rock's Waterfront lots, which were free in November, December and January to help local businesses and encourage outdoor activity, return to pay parking starting Monday, Feb. 1.

Waterfront rates during the shoulder season, from Feb. 1 to March 31, are \$2 an hour at the Waterfront and \$7.50 a day at the West Beach Parkade and the Montecito Parkade.

The City is communicating the update through the City's website, social media, LED signs at the Waterfront and the City Connects electronic newsletter. Free parking signage will be removed on Feb. 1.

# 5. Marine Drive Stabilization and Bin Wall Repair

**Department:** Engineering and Municipal Operations

**Summary:** The project for the stabilization of Marine Drive with micro piles is completed, except one week of paving work scheduled for late March. The project was initially projected to be finished well ahead of the planned completion date of Jan. 29. but the scope was extended to include anchoring and shotcrete sealing of the middle bin wall. Excavation around this bin wall as part of the micropile process showed that reinforcing was advisable. The other two bin walls do not need work at this time.

The contactor will leave a small fenced-in First Aid trailer in the Cypress parking lot until the paving works are completed in March.

Two-way traffic is returned and will remain during the March paving, although there will be temporary lane closures and delays during construction hours.

#### 8. Update from the Fire Chief on COVID-19

**Summary:** The Province reported 465 new cases of <u>COVID-19</u> yesterday along with six additional deaths. The province's death toll now stands at 1,240, increasing by 56 over the week.

There are currently 4,447 active cases in the province with another 6,943 people isolating due to possible exposure. B.C. has now recorded 69,245 total cases with just under 90 per cent of those having recovered. The Province reports the curve in B.C. is slowly moving downward.

Of the new cases, 234, or 50 per cent, are in the Fraser Health region; 98, or 21 per cent, are in the Vancouver Coastal region; 54 cases, or 12 per cent, are in Interior Health region; and 52 cases, or 11 per cent, are in the Northern Health region. The Province reports 257 patients in hospital with 76 of those in intensive care. This is the lowest number of hospitalizations reported since Nov. 22.

The Province has administered 145,567 doses of the COVID-19 vaccine, of which 8,097 were second doses.

# 7. Update on OCP Review: Building Heights outside the Town Centre Survey and Proposed Town Centre Zoning Amendment

**Department:** Planning and Development Services

**Summary:** The survey for the Building Heights Outside the Town Centre closes today (Feb. 12, 2021), and to date approximately 470 responses have been received. This information will be analyzed and presented to Council in a future report along with recommendations for policy changes in the Official Community Plan.

On Feb. 8, Council also considered proposed amendments to the Town Centre "CR-1" zone that would implement many of the Town Centre-related recommendations in the OCP Review.

The change to the CR-1 zone would, among other things, lower the density—the amount of building allowed on a property—for properties zoned CR-1. As not all members of Council were available for the vote, there was a decision to defer the vote on initial bylaw readings and schedule a public hearing to a future Council meeting.

If the decision is made to proceed to public hearing, the next opportunity is anticipated to be late April 2021. As directed by Council, once this public hearing is scheduled, the City will send an unaddressed mailout to all White Rock homes to inform residents of the public hearing and how to participate. This is in addition to the regularly required newspaper advertisements and other communication methods. Due to the timing of future Council meetings and public hearings, the overall current OCP Review, including both the Town Centre and outside the Town Centre aspects, is be anticipated to complete with bylaw amendment adoptions possible in May or June.

# 8. Update from the Fire Chief on COVID-19

**Summary:** The Province reported 449 new cases of COVID-19 yesterday along with nine additional deaths. The province's death toll now stands at 1,278. This is an increase of 38 over the week but

represents a 44-per-cent decrease in daily COVID-19 related deaths over the last seven days as compared to the previous reporting period.

There are currently 4,317 active cases in the province with another 6,869 people isolating due to possible exposure. B.C. has now recorded 72,305 total cases with 92 per cent of those having recovered. The Province reports relatively stable numbers, dipping slightly over the week.

Of the new cases, 242, or 54 per cent, are in the Fraser Health region; 93 cases, or 21 per cent, are in the Vancouver Coastal region; 58 cases, or 13 per cent, are in the Interior Health region; and 37 cases, or eight per cent, are in the Northern Health region. The Province reports 224 patients in hospital with 63 in intensive care. This is the lowest number of hospitalizations reported since Nov. 19.

The Province has administered 159,887 doses of COVID-19 vaccine, which includes 15,684 second doses.

Department: White Rock Fire Rescue

**Summary:** The Province reported 617 new cases of <u>COVID-19</u> yesterday along with four additional deaths. The province's death toll now stands at 1,321. This is an increase of 43 over the week and represents a 13-per-cent increase in daily COVID-19-related deaths over the last seven days, as compared to the previous reporting period. The number of new cases reported over the week has been stable, dropping one per cent over the previous reporting period.

The number of active cases has remained stable throughout the week and currently stands at 4,348 with another 7,440 people isolating due to possible exposure. B.C. has now recorded 75,327 total cases with 92 per cent of those having recovered.

Of the new cases, 342, or 55 per cent, are in the Fraser Health region; 146 cases, or 24 per cent, are in the Vancouver Coastal region; 17 cases, or three per cent, are in Interior Health region; and 92 cases, or 15 per cent, are in the Northern Health region. It was the highest daily total of new cases for Fraser Health since the start of January, and the highest single-day total of new cases recorded yet in Northern Health. The province reports 224 patients in hospital with 60 of those being in intensive care.

Brad Jalbert has created more than 140 hybrid roses to date. He will be providing the City's Parks team with a session on rose maintenance.

The Liberty Rose is an excellent landscape garden rose, with early flowering and non-stop blooming until frost. It is easy-care, drought-tolerant and very showy. Brad Jalbert states: "This rose is a tribute to all who have served, and will serve, including my late grandfather. 

# 10. Update from the Fire Chief on COVID-19

**Department:** White Rock Fire Rescue

**Summary:** The Province reported 395 new cases of COVID-19 yesterday along with 10 additional deaths. The province's death toll now stands at 1,348. This is an increase of 27 over the week but represents a 43-per-cent decrease in daily COVID-19-related deaths over the last seven days, compared with the previous reporting period.

B.C. has reported 116 cases of variants of concern across the province. Of the 116 cases, 95 have been the B.1.1.7 variant associated with the U.K. and 21 the B.1.3.1 variant associated with South Africa. Of the 116 variant cases detected, only nine remain active.

The number of active cases in our province now stands at 4,489 with another 7,931 people isolating due to possible exposure. B.C. has now recorded 78,673 total cases with approximately 92.5 per cent of those having recovered. The seven-day rolling average of new cases and the percentage of tests coming back positive have climbed in recent weeks.

Of the new cases, 207, or 52 per cent, are in the Fraser Health region; 86 cases, or 22 per cent, are in the Vancouver Coastal region; 24 cases, or six per cent, are in the Interior Health region; 41 cases, or

10 per cent, are in the Northern Health region; and 37 cases, or nine per cent, are in the Island Health region.

The Province reports 228 patients in hospital with 62 of those patients in intensive care.

The Province has administered 239,833 doses of the COVID-19 vaccine, which includes 68,157 second doses.

The application proposes to change the zoning of the property from the One Unit Residential (RS-1) Zone to the One Unit (12.1m Lot Width) Residential (RS-4) Zone.

Both the RS-1 Zone and the RS-4 Zone allow for a registered secondary suite. The general provisions of the Zoning Bylaw would need to be satisfied with any future development. The required parking supply for a one-unit residential use is two spaces per unit plus one space for a secondary suite.

Unit 107 - 15181 Thrift Ave.

The purpose of the meeting is to introduce a proposed zoning amendment application which, if approved, would permit an 89-square-metre (958-square-foot) mezzanine level to be installed in the new location for 3 Dogs Brewing in Phase 2 of Miramar Village.

The amendment would exempt the mezzanine floor space, which does not impact the exterior of the building, from counting toward the building's floor area. The building's floor area is at the current maximum of the CD-16 site-specific zone that applies to Miramar Village. This additional 89 square metres would allow about 46 seats for patrons.

# 8. Update from the Fire Chief on COVID-19

Department: White Rock Fire Rescue

**Summary:** British Columbia health officials reported 564 new cases of <u>COVID-19</u> on Thursday, along with four additional deaths.

The province's death toll now stands at 1,376. This represents a four-per-cent increase in daily COVID-19-related deaths over the last seven days.

B.C. has reported 46 new cases of COVID-19 variants of concern, bringing the total so far to 246. Just 16 of those cases remain active, with four of them in hospital. Two people have died from the variants.

The number of active cases in our province now stands at 4,743. Another 8,659 people are isolating due to possible exposure. B.C. has now recorded 82,473 total cases with 92 per cent of those having recovered. The seven-day rolling average number of new cases has risen to 527, up from 501 reported last week.

Of the new cases, 279, or 49 per cent, are in the Fraser Health region; 168 cases, or 30 per cent, are in the Vancouver Coastal region; 36 cases, or six per cent, are in the Interior Health region; 46 cases, or eight per cent, are in the Northern Health region; and 35, or six per cent, are in the Island Health region.

The Province reports 248 patients in hospital with 63 of them in intensive care.

The Province announced Monday it would wait up to four months to administer vaccine second doses, allowing everyone who wants a shot to have one by the end of July. To date, B.C. has administered 298,851 doses of the COVID-19 vaccine, including 86,746 second doses.

**Summary:** The City will be creating van-accessible parking stalls at City-owned facilities, including the Waterfront. The work will begin next week, weather-permitting, and will include the conversion of existing parking stalls and accessible parking stalls. Existing parking stalls and existing wide, accessible parking stalls can be modified to accommodate additional van-accessible parking stalls.

A van-accessible parking stall requires 5.5 metres by 3.4 metres in width with a 5.5 metre by 1.5-metre-wide aisle. Increasing the number of van-accessible parking stalls is beneficial for people in motorized scooters and wheelchairs.



# 8. Update from the Fire Chief on COVID-19

**Department: White Rock Fire Rescue** 

**Summary:** B.C. reported 569 new cases of <u>COVID-19</u> on Thursday, along with three additional deaths. The number of new cases has risen four per cent over the week.

The three deaths bring the province's COVID-19 death toll to 1,397.

B.C.'s positivity rate is currently at 6.6 per cent compared to Fraser Health at 7.6 per cent. Most new cases in Fraser Health are occurring in Surrey, which reported 863 new cases in the last week.

The seven-day provincial rolling average number of new cases has risen to 532 up from 527 reported last week.

There has been a total of 86,219 cases of COVID-19 in B.C., with 4,912 remaining active.

The number of people in hospital with the disease remained unchanged at 244. Of those, 68 are in intensive care. In total, 79,829 people have recovered from COVID-19.

To date, B.C. has administered 366,791 doses of COVID-19 vaccine, including 87,009 second doses.

#### 6. Marine Drive Road Reconstruction Works


**Department:** Engineering and Municipal Operations

### 9. Update from the Fire Chief on COVID-19

**Department:** White Rock Fire Rescue

**Summary:** B.C. reported 622 new cases of <u>COVID-19</u> on Thursday, along with eight additional deaths. The eight deaths bring the province's COVID-19 death toll to 1,419 people.

Of the new cases, 51 per cent were reported in the Fraser Health region compared with 30 per cent in the Vancouver Coastal region. The number of new cases in B.C. has risen four per cent over the week.

Officials on Thursday also reported 136 new cases of COVID-19 variants of concern, bringing the provincial total to 1,132, of which 143 remain active.

There has been a total of 90,048 cases of COVID-19 since the pandemic began, with 4,941 cases remaining active. There are currently 9,620 people isolating due to potential exposure while over 92 per cent of B.C.'s cases have recovered.

The seven-day provincial rolling average number of new cases has risen to 557, up from 532 reported last week.

The number of people in hospital with the disease has increased 15 per cent over the week with 286 people in hospital, 85 of them in intensive care.

The Province announced it would use its next shipments of the AstraZeneca/SII vaccine to immunize front-line workers, including teachers, child-care workers and first responders outside of its current age-based system. To date, B.C. has administered 465,584 of COVID-19 vaccine with approximately 7.5 per cent of the population receiving its first dose.

# 2. Waterfront Pay Parking Update: Summer Season Rates

**Department:** Financial Services

Summary: On April 1, Summer season Pay Parking Rates will take effect. A Value rate of \$3.25/hour will apply to all stalls located West of Oxford Street. The Prime rate of \$3.75/hour will apply in stalls East of Oxford Street, including East Beach. West Beach and Montecito Parkades will offer a daily rate of \$15. Except for the two Parkades, a four-hour limit applies in the Prime areas of West Beach to support local businesses and encourage turnover. The Prime area in West Beach includes all pay parking East of Oxford Street.

White Rock firefighters are already trained to administer Naloxone through intramuscular injection. Firefighters participating in the vaccine rollout will have to complete an additional 6.5 hours of training to qualify as a vaccine immunizer for Fraser Health.

South Surrey vaccination site locations include the South Surrey Park and Ride lot at 13800 King George Blvd. (drive-through only) and, opening March 31, the South Surrey Recreation Centre at 14601 20 Ave.


# 4. White Rock Pier: Broken Pile Repair

Lihau He has been hired and will start April 12. Lihau brings extensive water, sewer and transportation design and project management experience from the private sector. In addition to work in the transportation and project management areas, Lihau will be tasked with updating water and sewer plans and delivering the infrastructure upgrades identified in these plans.

Interviews for the vacant Parks Manager position are underway. Recruitment will start shortly for the Project Engineer (Facilities and Parks) whose first priority will be the delivery of a Facilities Master Plan.

### 9. Update from the Fire Chief on COVID-19

**Summary:** B.C. announced 800 new cases of <u>COVID-19</u> on Thursday and reported the rolling seven-day average of new cases is up 25 per cent over the last eight days. The Province also reported five more deaths, bringing that total to 1,446.

Of the new cases, 381 were reported to be in the Fraser Health region compared to 264 in the Vancouver Coastal region.

Officials on Thursday also reported 191 new cases of COVID-19 variants of concern, bringing the provincial total to 1,772 — 215 of which remain active. Over the last week, the total number of cases of the B.1.1.7 variant, first identified in the U.K., have grown by 50 per cent and the P.1 variant, first identified in Brazil, more than tripled.

There has been a total of 94,769 cases of COVID-19 since the pandemic began, of which 5,856 remain active. There are currently just under 10,000 people isolating due to potential exposure.

The number of people in hospital increased to 306. Of those, 79 are in intensive care.

The Province announced it would it was easing restrictions on visitation to long-term care and assisted-living facilities now that most residents, staff and essential visitors have been vaccinated. The Province also announced it would permit limited indoor, in-person religious gathering on select days between March 28 and April 13 to accommodate upcoming major religious holidays.

To date, B.C. has administered 523,459 doses of the COVID-19 vaccine. Of those, 82,212 people have also had the second booster shot.

# 2. Waterfront Pay Parking Update: Summer Season Starts April 1

**Department:** Financial Services

**Summary**: Pay parking in White Rock changes to summer season rates at all Waterfront parking locations starting April 1. The hourly rate for all spaces is \$3.75 an hour. A four-hour limit applies to parking from the White Rock Pier to Oxford Street. **Please note there is no longer a value rate for parking west of Oxford Street.** 

For all-day parking, the Montecito and West Beach Parkades on Vidal Street, just north of Marine Drive, offer a daily rate of \$15. The City is reminding Waterfront visitors of the seasonal rates through the three LED signs at the Waterfront, a news item on the City's website, an update in the e-newsletter City Connects, social media posts and by updating the Parking web page at <a href="whiterockcity.ca/parking">whiterockcity.ca/parking</a> Contact: Ralph Volkens

Potential qualified providers have been requested to submit their proposals by April 15, 2021.

# 6. Fire Safety Checklist for Multi-Residential Buildings (Strata)

**Department:** White Rock Fire Rescue

**Summary:** In partnership with Strata Councils within the city, White Rock Fire Rescue has implemented a new inspection program during the pandemic. On March 26, letters were sent to all Strata-managed Multi-Residential Buildings with an enclosed self-inspection checklist and a contact information form to complete and return.

The self-inspection program is intended to be a temporary solution to help reduce the spread of COVID-19 and to help maintain fire safety awareness and compliance in the community. The regular inspection program will resume when it's safe to do so, as advised by the Provincial Health Officer.

# 9. Update from the Fire Chief on COVID-19

**Summary:** B.C. announced 1,013 new cases of <u>COVID-19</u> on Wednesday along with three more deaths. This is the highest ever single-day total reported. The rolling seven-day average number of new cases is now at 868. The death toll in B.C. currently stands at 1,458. Of the new cases, 458 were reported to be in the Fraser Health region compared to 385 in the Vancouver Coastal region.

There has been a total of 100,048 cases of COVID-19 since the pandemic began, of which 7,405 remain active. About 91 per cent of B.C.'s total cases have recovered.

There are 306 people in hospital due to COVID-19, 80 of whom are in intensive care. This number has increased by 25 per cent over the month.

To date, B.C. has administered at least one dose of COVID-19 vaccine to 668,729 people, about 13 per cent of B.C.'s population. Of those, 87,351 people have also had the second dose.

Officials on Wednesday announced Lower Mainland residents aged 55 to 65 years are now eligible to receive the Oxford-AstraZeneca vaccine. Vaccination registration began March 31 at community pharmacies in the Vancouver Coastal and Fraser health regions.

# 2. Peace Arch Hospital Free Parking Update (Redacted S. 15

**Summary:** In support of health care workers, patients and visitors to Peace Arch Hospital during the pandemic, the City suspended pay parking around the hospital in early 2020.

The public art piece was first unveiled at a ceremony with members of the Peace Arch Hospital Auxiliary on Oct. 2, 2019. The signpost and artist's statement plaque were designed to complement the piece of public art, completing the project. The plaque describes the art from the artist's perspective.

The City of White Rock commissioned this public art installation in honour of the 70th anniversary of the Peace Arch Hospital Auxiliary.

#### ARTIST'S STATEMENT

"STANDE is a recrament to the selfessness of the White Rock Woman's Anxiliary and its continued contributions to this community. Starting with its founding members in 1947, the Auxiliary's pragmatic poet-was visionary force coalesced with its civic vistue to raise community support in order to establish a community hospital. The Pezce Arch Hospital was realized in 1954. Metaphotically, STANDE draws on the form of the pre-contact rainforest that once awood on the hospital site. This imagery highlights the strength, thelter, support and nusturing that these dedicated women believed was necessary for the future growth and success of their community, White Rock."

  - 4. City of Surrey Traffic Data Collection (Roper Avenue and Stayte Road)

**Department:** Engineering and Municipal Operations

**Summary:** The City of Surrey is scheduled to collect turning-movement and pedestrian data from the crosswalk of 13 Avenue and 160 Street (Roper Avenue and Stayte Road) in White Rock.

The crew will be using a Miovision Scout collection system to collect low-resolution video, which will then be processed through artificial intelligence to get the turning-movement count data. The Miovision Scout is typically installed by being strapped to a streetlight or traffic light. At this location, however, there are no City of Surrey streetlights available. Therefore, the City of Surrey has requested to strap the Miovision Scout onto a City of White Rock's streetlight poles.

The device will be installed for approximately 48 hours starting Wednesday, April 14, 2021 and being removed on Friday, April 16, 2021. The device has stickers on it that identify that it belongs to the City of Surrey.

# 6. Update from the Fire Chief on COVID-19

**Department:** White Rock Fire Rescue

**Summary:** B.C. announced 1,293 new cases of <u>COVID-19</u> yesterday along with two new deaths. This is the highest ever single-day total reported. The rolling seven-day average number of new cases is now at 1,048, increasing by 18 per cent over the week. The death toll in B.C. currently stands at 1,493.

Of the new cases, 50 per cent are reported to be in the Fraser Health region compared to 35 per cent in the Vancouver Coastal region.

There has been a total of 108,278 cases of COVID-19 since the pandemic began, of which 9,184 remain active and a record 15,203 people are in isolation due to possible exposure. The number of

active cases has risen by 20 per cent over the week.

There are currently 336 people in hospital due to COVID-19, 101 of whom are in intensive care. This number has increased by 14 per cent over the week.

To date, B.C. has administered at least one dose of COVID-19 vaccine to 995,000 people.

Officials on Thursday announced the Province will now cease tracking individual variants of concern and proceed on the assumption that the variants are now dominant in community transmission.

- B.C. reported 1,293 new cases of COVID-19 yesterday. This is the highest ever single-day total reported.
- The number of active cases has risen by 20 per cent over the week.



# 1. Parkade Signage Enhancement

**Department:** Engineering and Municipal Operations

**Summary:** The City has scheduled the removal of existing Parkade directional signs on Marine Drive and will be installing new universally recognized signs for parking: the blue "P" with directional arrows. The installation of the six new signs will follow road safety regulations that dictate the size and placement of signs. The proposed locations are shown in the sign plan attached and will be installed on Friday, April 16.



In addition, new "Additional Parking at Vidal St. (Parkade)" signs will be installed at the parking lot exits on Marine Drive, West Beach parking lots. This work is scheduled for the following week upon completion of the installation of the Parkade signs, with the blue "P" and directional arrows, on Marine Drive.

# 2. Pedestrian Crosswalks Reinstated on Marine Drive

**Summary:** The pedestrian crosswalks located at Marine Drive/Centre Street and Marine Drive/Dolphin Street have been scheduled to be reinstated following the paving work on Marine Drive between

Johnston Road and Cypress Street.

The pedestrian crosswalks' application will be high-quality thermoplastic with a stamped paver look that will last much longer than traditional paint—similar to ones previously installed on Marine Drive. This work is scheduled to start on Friday, April 16 and to be completed by April 17.

A flag person will be present for single-lane, alternating traffic control on Marine Drive.

The organizers of the 2021 market have met nearly all of the conditions required by the City to open to the public. City staff are working with the organizers to finalize right-of-way permits, insurance requirements, a COVID-19 safety plan and other operational and logistical tasks.

The organizers have received the approval of Council and the three Miramar Strata Councils to host this year's market in Miramar Village Plaza.

The White rock Farmers' Market provides a source of fresh, local food products for residents. It also provides economic spin-offs to Town Centre businesses and income for many local food and beverage vendors and artisans.

# 4. The Meeting Public Art by Wang Shugang purchased by BOSA for Miramar Plaza



**Department:** Recreation and Culture

**Summary:** New artwork was installed late last week at the BOSA Miramar Towers Plaza at the Johnston Road entrance. Staff learned that BOSA recently secured Wang Shugang's *The Meeting*, an internationally renowned artwork, for permanent display in White Rock at the Miramar Village Plaza. BOSA paid for, and chose, the artwork without City involvement. Since is was not a site-specific designed project, a call for artists and selection panel involving the City or Council's Public Art Advisory Committee were not used. BOSA will maintain the artwork.

The Spirit Bear that BOSA purchased is being repaired and will also be installed and maintained by BOSA in the Plaza.

BOSA will be releasing a public statement shortly regarding *The Meeting*.

- The Meeting Public Art Installation by Wang Shugang was installed by BOSA in Miramar Village Plaza on April 9, 2021.
  - The artwork and artist are internationally renowned (more information below).
  - Public art is an important part of creating interesting and engaging public spaces. The Meeting adds to the cultural corridor imagined for Johnston Road by our local arts community.
  - This is a private purchase on private property and will be maintained by BOSA.
  - The Meeting is installed at the east entrance to the Miramar Plaza off Johnston Road.

The Meeting: Created for the 2007 G8 Summit in Germany, The Meeting made its North American debut at the 2009 - 2011 Vancouver Biennale exhibition in Coal Harbour where it attracted an endless number of visitors eager to playfully engage with the artwork. In 2017, it was loaned by the Biennale to the Montreal Museum of Fine Arts for an exhibition celebrating the 375th anniversary of Montreal, the 50th anniversary of Expo 67 and the 150th anniversary of Canada. The Meeting has also been on display in Edmonton and North Vancouver. Created by Chinese artist Wang Shugang, The Meeting is a constellation of eight crouching Buddhist monks painted a vivid red. Open to various interpretations, one wonders if they are deep in diplomatic negotiations, quietly meditating or simply enjoying a conversation amongst friends. Though born in Beijing, China in 1960, Wang Shugang lived for ten years in Germany's Ruhr region. He returned to live in Beijing, China in 2000, at 40 years old. Wang Shugang is one of the leading contemporary artists in the post-revolutionary breakout period of the mid 1990s, referred to as Cynical Realism. He, together with his contemporaries Yue Minjun and Ai Weiwei, playfully and astutely mocks the history and political events of the Cultural Revolution and Maoist China. Since 1991, Wang Shugang's works are regularly seen in solo exhibitions in Germany and China. Wang Shugang's figurative sculptures have been influenced by both the Western art tradition and contemporary twentieth-century realism while also expressing Buddhist iconography combined with Chinese everyday culture. The artist generally uses only a few colors on his sculpture, painting them solid red, white, black or bronze. These colors have become a kind of language or a trademark of the artist. Typical of the work of Wang Shugang are the red "sweeping monks" and the "squatting" figures. (https://www.vancouverbiennale.com/artists/wang-shugang/)



# 8. Update from the Fire Chief on COVID-19

Department: White Rock Fire Rescue

**Summary:** B.C. announced 1,205 new cases of <u>COVID-19</u> yesterday along with three new deaths. This is the fourth time in eight days the Province has reported more than 1,200 cases in a single day. The death toll in B.C. currently stands at 1,524.

Of the new cases, 60 per cent are reported to be in the Fraser Health region compared with 25 per cent in the Vancouver Coastal region.

There has been a total of 116,075 cases of COVID-19 since the pandemic began. Of those cases, 10,052 remain active and a record 16,217 people are in isolation due to possible exposure. The number of active cases has risen by 10 per cent over the week.

There are currently 409 people in hospital due to COVID-19, climbing over 400 for the first time in the pandemic. A record 125 of those patients are in intensive care.

To date, B.C. has administered at least one dose of the COVID-19 vaccine to 1,235,863 people, which is about 22 per cent of the population.

Officials on Thursday delivered new modelling showing the virus on track to hit 3,000 cases per day, if the trends do not change. Provincial Health Officer Dr. Bonnie Henry stated "the rate of infectious contacts where the virus can be transmitted to others, is somewhere around 55 to 60 percent. We need to be down to 40 per cent or less."

# 5. Spring Training Week for White Rock Firefighters

**Summary:** White Rock Firefighters are wrapping up Spring Training Week today that focused on the maintenance of specialty skills. This year's key program was the IAFF Fire Ground Survival Awareness Course. The purpose of the program is to ensure that training for Mayday prevention and Mayday operations are consistent among all firefighters, company officers and chief officers. The training teaches firefighters to perform potentially life-saving actions if they become lost, disorientated, injured, low on air or trapped.

# 6. Update from the Fire Chief on COVID-19

Department: White Rock Fire Rescue

Summary: B.C. announced 1,006 new cases of <a href="COVID-19">COVID-19</a> yesterday along with four more deaths. The death toll in B.C. currently stands at 1,550. The rolling seven-day average number of new cases is trending downwards and currently stands at 955, down from 1,130 reported on April 12. Of the new cases, 60 per cent are reported to be in the Fraser Health region compared to 24 per cent in the Vancouver Coastal region.

There has been a total of 122,757 cases of COVID-19 since the pandemic began, of which remain active. The number of active cases has declined by 12 per cent over the last week.

There are currently 502 people in hospital due to COVID-19, climbing over 500 for the first time in the pandemic with a record 161 of those people in intensive care. The Province is postponing an estimated 1,750 scheduled surgeries at nine hospitals across the Lower Mainland over the next two weeks due to rising pressure on the health care system.

To date, B.C. has administered at least one dose of COVID-19 vaccine to 1.5 million people, which equates to approximately 29 per cent of the population. The Province began scheduling vaccine bookings for people 60 years and above on Thursday with registration opening to all British Columbians older than 18 today.

# 1. Engineering Company Wins Award for Design of White Rock Pier Repairs

**Department:** Engineering and Municipal Operations

**Summary:** Westmar Advisors has won an award of merit from the Association of Consulting Engineering Companies of B.C. for the company's design work for the repairs to the White Rock Pier after it was severely damaged in 2018. The City will be communicating the award through media relations, the web and social media.

On Dec. 20, 2018, a powerful storm swept over B.C.'s Lower Mainland. White Rock was particularly hard-hit and suffered extensive damage to its Waterfront, including the iconic Pier. The Pier and the marina in front of it were exposed to the storm's full intensity. Most of the marina and the vessels within it were destroyed and the Pier suffered extensive structural damage along its length, with a 100-metre section completely torn away.

Westmar created an innovative design for the new section of the Pier that was strong, economical, quick to install, and had minimal impacts to the sensitive inter-tidal areas surrounding the Pier. The design also provided a simple and efficient method to raise the Pier in the future. Effective strategies were put in place to ensure permitting and construction were completed quickly so the City's primary tourist attraction could be opened to the public as planned on Aug. 27, 2019, in time for the Labour Day Long Weekend.

Westmar recognized that the Pier is socially, culturally, and economically important to White Rock and that the repairs needed to be completed as quickly as possible. The new Pier section had to be cost-effective while being robust enough to withstand similar future storms. It had to be capable of withstanding the seismic event specified by current codes, had to be visually compatible with the existing Pier, and needed to fit into the sections that remained after the storm. The new section also had to enable the Pier to be raised in the future to account for anticipated sea level rise.



# 2. Hanging Baskets and Garden Beds

# 3. Bay Street and Cypress Street Accessible Ramps Project: June to August 2021

**Department:** Engineering and Municipal Operations

**Summary:** The ramps at Cypress Street and Bay Street were damaged by storms in 2020 and 2021. Although repairs were made, both ramps pose mobility challenges to people using wheelchairs, scooters and strollers.

To improve accessibility, the City began the Bay Street and Cypress Street accessible ramps project in late 2020 and has now completed the design and most of the extensive permitting, including archaeological permitting. The upcoming installation work includes construction of a 3.5-metre-wide beach ramp at Bay Street and extension of the existing ramp at Cypress Street to provide accessible connections to the beach. Construction of the project will begin, weather-permitting, late June 2020 and be completed by Aug. 30, with construction taking place from Monday to Saturday.

Signage will be placed on site. The beach access at Bay Street and Cypress Street will be unavailable during the construction work. Portions of the Promenade and nearby parking will be affected by closures during construction hours, Monday to Friday, 7:30 a.m. to 9 p.m. and Saturday, 9:30 a.m. to 5 p.m.

On May 10, Council will consider a report recommending funding adjustments for this project.

The rolling seven-day average number of new cases continues to trend downwards and currently stands at 697, dropping about 20 per cent over the week. Of the new cases reported, 65 per cent are in the Fraser Health region compared to 22 per cent in the Vancouver Coastal region.

There has been a total of 133,619 cases of COVID-19 since the pandemic began, with 6,802 remaining active. This is the lowest number of active cases reported in the last six weeks. About 94 per cent, or 125,025 cases, have recovered

There are currently 457 people in hospital due to COVID-19, with 154 are in intensive care.

To date, B.C. has administered at least one dose of COVID-19 vaccine to about two million people, which is about to 37 per cent of the population. The Province began scheduling vaccine bookings for people aged 49 years and older on Thursday with registration open to all British Columbians 18 and over. The Province announced it would alter its vaccination campaign to include young people, following approval of the Pfizer vaccine for youth aged 12 and up.

# 1. Filming at the White Rock Pier, Beach and Promenade: May 19

**Department:** Recreation and Culture

**Summary:** A film permit will be issued for May 19 for Strive Films. The filming will take place primarily on the beach, under the White Rock Pier, as well as a short walking scene on the Promenade near the head of the pier. Neighbourhood notification letters will be distributed from May 14 to 17, pending final approval.

Filming activities:

- 7 a.m. to noon: Small crew prepares the area.
- Noon to 1 p.m.: More crew and work trucks arrive.
- 1 p.m. to 9:30 p.m.: Full crew will arrive and start filming. (This includes a scene of lead character walking along, a scene with an actor that struggles with a tough decision to put down his dog, and happy moments of our actor and his dog on the beach.)
- 9:30 to 11 p.m.: All equipment will be quietly packed up and leave the area.

Note: The actor will have a gun shooting blanks, approximately three to five times between 4 p.m. and 8 p.m. on the beach. The White Rock RCMP will be on site to help isolate the area and supervise the film set.

The crew will be conducting intermittent pedestrian control to keep scene clear. The production has a COVID-19 safety plan and protocols in place. Essential work trucks will be parked on the west side of the White Rock Museum building and crew vehicles will be parking in the West Beach Parkade or Montecito Parkade. City power will be used to eliminate need for a generator to power an essential work truck.

### 1. Large Part of Tree Falls on Elm Street

Departments: Engineering and Municipal Operations; White Rock Fire Rescue

**Summary:** On May 18, shortly after 3 a.m., White Rock Fire Rescue received a call to 1156 Elm Street with a report of live wires on site. White Rock RCMP and White Rock Fire Rescue both responded. White Rock Fire Rescue stayed on scene until BC Hydro arrived to respond to potential danger from the wires.

The City's Operations team also arrived on site and determined that a very large section of a tree, known as a scaffold branch, had fallen from a heritage elm tree, hit a power pole and then landed partially on the roof of the house at 1156 Elm.

The City arranged for the tree branches to be removed and had the area cleaned up by 5 p.m.

The City will follow up with tree risk evaluations for all three City elm trees on the street.

**Department: Information Technology** 


**Summary:** From broken streetlights to illegal dumping and graffiti removal, the City handles thousands of service requests a year. Most of these requests are submitted and processed through this <u>interface</u> on our website. Requests are then managed internally through a series of workflows. The legacy application used to manage the *calls for service* requests doesn't have a native, user-friendly reporting capability. To accomplish this, we built a graphically rich PowerBI dashboard that leverages the power of the cloud technology. To maintain the privacy, data is grouped by the postal code of the area in question.


Dashboards are designed for quick analysis and informational awareness, with a focus on presenting operational and analytical data. Data dashboards surface the necessary data to understand, monitor and improve a business through visual representations.

## 9. Update from the Fire Chief on COVID-19

## **Department:** White Rock Fire Rescue

B.C. announced 378 new cases of <u>COVID-19</u> yesterday along with seven new deaths. This pushes the province's seven-day rolling average number of new cases to 330, up slightly from the seven-month low of 327 reported on Wednesday. The death toll in B.C. is now at 1,690.

Of the new cases reported, 50 per cent are in the Fraser Health region compared to 26 per cent in the Vancouver Coastal region. The number of new cases has decreased by 26 per cent over the last week.

There has been a total of 143,264 cases of COVID-19 since the pandemic began, of which 3,543 remain active. The number of active cases has declined 24 per cent over the last seven days. Approximately 96 per cent of reported cases are considered to have recovered.

There are currently 286 people in hospital due to COVID-19, of which 88 are in intensive care. Hospitalizations continue to trend downward and have dropped 10 per cent over the last week.

To date, B.C. has administered at least one dose of COVID-19 vaccine to approximately 2.87 million people, which equates to 56 per cent of the population. B.C. public health officials announced Thursday that people will be offered their second dose of Pfizer or Moderna vaccine about eight weeks after their first dose, shortening the gap between doses from the original plan of 16 weeks.

On Tuesday, B.C. officials unveiled a four-step plan to ease pandemic restrictions. The restart plan will follow approximate timelines based on vaccination rates continuing to rise across the province and <u>COVID-19</u> cases continuing to decline.
